This Friday's show at Chromatic Coffee is a deceptively powerful lineup with a harmonious mix of stripped down emo, punchy rock, shoegaze pop and everything in between. OBJECT HEAVY

Channeling everything from early Motown to Steely Dan (and maybe even progressive rock heroes Yes), the Arcata, CA, based Object Heavy frankly tends towards love-making music, with soulful grooves, impeccable timing, and a carefree attitude in its sonic explorations. Object Heavy are touring in support of their recently released first full length, Love & Gravity, a title which cements their affinity for mass and physics. INT'L DANCE FEST

As proof, look no further than the Peninsula International Dance Festival, now in its second year at San Mateo Performing Arts Center. The fest brings together artists from 21 companies representing 200-plus unique, talented performers. The two performances include traditional work from South America, Africa, Asia, Europe and native dances of the United States. DIANA KRALL

Wine paired with mid-summer and jazz sung by none other than Diana Krall quarantees a dreamy Sunday evening. Hailing from Canada, the renowned Krall is known for her dulcet contralto voice, which has made her the only jazz singer to have eight albums debut at the top of the Billboard Jazz Albums chart. She is also a two-time Grammy winner — not to mention a frequent musical collaborator with her husband, Elvis Costello. In 2020, Krall released This Dream of You, a tribute to her later producer Tommy LiPuma and a triumph of sultry and sweet jazz artistry. It's an enchanted Sunday evening in Saratoga. (AM)
